This course will look at different ethical issues and religious beliefs relevant to our world today. Each of the ethical issues are studied from a religious and non-religious perspective.

There are two papers, each one hour and 45 minutes long.

Paper 1 – Religion & Ethics

Including the study of issues such as:

Marriage and the Family (such as divorce, marriage, cohabitation, contraception and homosexuality)

Living a Religious Life

Key beliefs in Christianity

Matters of Life and Death (such as abortion, euthanasia and life after death).

Paper 2 – Religion, Peace & Conflict

Including the study of issues such as:

Key beliefs in Islam

Crime and Punishment (issues include punishment, justice, treatment of criminals and capital punishment)

Living the Religious Life

Peace and Conflict (issues include recent conflicts, Just war, Weapons of Mass Destruction, Peacekeeping, Holy War).



Why take Religious Studies GCSE?

- Many employers (especially the police, armed forces and caring professions) regard Religious Studies GCSE
 as a good qualification. It involves a lot of thinking and discussion and shows that you are aware of other
 people's beliefs and the nature of the society in which you live.
