Sixth Form Dress Code

The key look is 'smart-casual' or' office wear'. What this means in practice is:

<u>Girls</u>

- Smart trousers / dark blue or black jeans / skirt (knee length unless worn with opaque tights)
- Formal shoes / smart boots / smart, clean trainers (dark blue or black)
- Blouse / smart top or jumper (not sweatshirt)
- Blazer (to be worn at all times)
- Leggings are <u>only</u> acceptable if worn under a mid-thigh length dress or tunic.

Boys

- Smart trousers / dark blue or black jeans
- Shirt (tie optional) / smart jumper (not sweatshirt) / polo shirt / plain T-shirt
- Blazer (to be worn at all times)
- Formal shoes / smart clean trainers (dark blue or black).

Not allowed

- 'Ripped tops' / torn jeans
- Leather or denim jackets
- Tracksuit bottoms or jeggings
- UGG style boots
- Cropped tops

- Hoodies or sweatshirts
- Outdoor coats
- Bright coloured / fluorescent trainers
- Shorts

Students are expected to be appropriately dressed at <u>all times</u>, across the <u>whole school site</u> (this <u>includes wearing a smart blazer</u>).

If students fail to comply, they will be given one warning and will then lose certain Sixth Form privileges, such as 'designated frees' or permission to go off site at lunch time.
