Prep I is an exciting transition into Key Stage 1 where the learning becomes more formal and the children are encouraged to become more independent in their learning. We use a range of teaching strategies in an enjoyable, hardworking environment which allows the children to flourish and become confident learners.

Prep I teaching team

Prep I is led by the highly experienced Mrs C Davies, teacher and numeracy co-ordinator.

Mrs Davies is supported in the classroom by Mrs J Seward, a full-time teaching assistant with a teaching degree.

The children are also taught by specialist teachers in such subjects as Science, PE, Music and Forest School, all under the care of Mr Rooney, Head of the Prep Department.

Our 'open-door' policy

Our 'open-door' policy continues through Prep to encourage openness and transparency and ensure a true partnership where parents feel fully informed and involved in their children's learning.

Parents' Evenings are held in October and March and all Prep I parents receive a full school report in July.

The Curriculum

Whatever the challenge, we use our curiosity and brainpower to work it out.

Literacy

There is a huge emphasis on phonics and reading in Prep I. The children develop their handwriting skills and use a wide range of texts to help develop their writing, with work often linked to our current topic.

Numeracy

We use a range of practical and challenging methods to develop all areas of maths including number and place value, fractions, telling the time, plus addition, subtraction, and introducing multiplication and division.



Science

Our lessons are strongly linked with our topic work focusing on areas such as animal habitats, forces, materials and healthy eating. Pupils take part in fun and practical science experiments to apply and further develop their knowledge.

Topic

Geography and history work is taught through our topics. These include All About Me, Africa and The Seaside.

Our art and design lessons also link in with the topic areas.

Extra-curricular

Our children flourish socially, physically and emotionally through a variety of inclusive experiences and opportunities designed to feed the imagination and grow young minds.

Extra-curricular clubs provide a perfect opportunity for children to challenge themselves and try something new. Activities on offer for Prep I pupils include Art Club, Drama, Judo and Sports.

Enrichment

In addition to regular visits to Worsley Woods, class trips include those to local places of interest such as the theatre, Manchester Airport and the seaside.

Seasonally, the children also participate in events including:

- Charitable fundraising events such as Comic Relief's Red Nose Day.

Essential Information – The School Day

The school day

Drop-off & collection

Children should be dropped off at the front of the Prep building (accessed via the pedestrian gate) between 8:30am and 8:45am, where a member of the teaching staff will be awaiting their arrival.

Our Prep I class finish their day at 3.20pm at which time the children will be brought to the front of the Prep Building ready for parents to collect.

Lunchtime

All children are offered a delicious, nutritious school lunch, freshly prepared and cooked on the premises by our catering team. We offer menu options on a 3-week rotation and aim to cater for all diets, cultures and religions.

A healthy snack

Please send in a healthy snack such as a piece of fruit, to be eaten at morning break (no nuts).

Children should also have a refillable water bottle.

'Extended Day' facility

Early Club begins at 7.30am and is available for children from Kindergarten through to Prep VI. Later in the day, Prep children who are not collected by 3.45pm are taken to Wraparound Club in the Prep Library where they are looked after by trained staff until 6pm. For your convenience, you can take advantage of our 'Extended Day' facility without prior notice. No advance booking is required.

There is a small additional charge for these facilities. Please see our 'Extended Day' leaflet for further details.

Homework

Homework is a very important aspect of the pupils' development. Homework is set to cement an effective partnership between school and parents in pursuing the aims of Bridgewater School. It is designed to reinforce skills and understanding, particularly in literacy and numeracy.

Reading is the most important homework in Prep I, we expect the children to read for at least 10 minutes each night with an adult, to promote a life-long love of reading and to further reinforce their literacy skills.

Online learning programmes have significantly benefitted our homework provision. The use of Reading Eggs and other online games have enabled our pupils to develop their skills in a fun and accessible way.

This homework is supplemented by more traditional activities such as spelling, literacy and maths.

Essential Information – School Uniform

The school dress code

A full uniform list is included within the Prep Parent Handbook and is also available from the school office.

Here are some important points in brief:



- Girls should wear regulation pinafores. Summer dresses are compulsory for all girls after the Easter holiday
- White ankle or long socks with summer dresses and grey or black opaque tights or long socks

with winter uniform

- Shoes should be a black, full shoe with adequate foot support. In summer, sandals must have closed toes and heels. Boots of any kind are not permitted
- Top coats must be regulation and bought from the school outfitters
- No jewellery may be worn. Girls with pierced ears may wear one stud in each ear no hoops
- · Long hair must be tied back with either navy or black hair bands
- Trainers are essential for playing outside. Please send a pair into school that can remain in class. (Black PE pumps are not required)
- All pupils must use the standard school bag. The larger, junior bag for Prep I to VI will be needed from September
- All uniform must be clearly labelled with your child's name.
