

Literacy


In literacy Prep V study a wide range of cross-curricular texts relevant to our topic work such as 'The Highwayman', 'Macbeth' and 'Street Child'.

Pupils learn to apply cursive handwriting throughout their work and to take pride in their presentation.

Prep V have weekly grammar activities and weekly spelling tests.

Numeracy

Prep V follow a range of numeracy areas such as mental arithmetic, problem solving, measure & shape and data-handling. Pupils have the opportunity to apply these new skills in a range of mathematical investigations.



Science

Our science topics include living things, materials and space. Pupils take part in fun and practical science experiments to apply their knowledge and learning.

Art

Prep V explore a range of art and design skills including drawing, 3D artwork and collage. Pupils will also explore printing and use clay and paper mache. Artists studied include Hokusai and William Morris.




Topic

Prep V follow a range of cross-curricular topics including Victorians, Greeks, Mayans, rivers, mountains and the rainforest. Through these topics the pupils learn a range of geography & history skills.

We use an array of investigative and practical methods to support pupils' learning including use of the local area and Worsley Woods.

Extra-curricular

Our children flourish socially, physically and emotionally through a variety of inclusive experiences and opportunities designed to feed the imagination and grow young minds.

Extra-curricular clubs provide a perfect opportunity for children to challenge themselves and try something new. Activities on offer for Prep V pupils include Chess Club, Choir, Drama, Judo, Karate, Library Club and Sports.

Enrichment

In addition to regular visits to Worsley Woods, class trips include those to local places of interest such as the theatre. Prep V also enjoy an annual residential trip which incorporates team building skills, outdoor and adventure challenges and, of course, lots of fun.

Seasonally, the children also participate in events including:

Essential Information – The School Day

The school day

Drop-off & collection

Children should be dropped off at the front of the Prep building (accessed via the pedestrian gate) between 8:30am and 8:45am, where a member of the teaching staff will be awaiting their arrival.

Our Prep V class finish their day at 3.30pm at which time the children will be brought to the front of the Prep Building ready for parents to collect.

Lunchtime

All children are offered a delicious, nutritious school lunch, freshly prepared and cooked on the premises by our catering team. We offer menu options on a 3-week rotation and aim to cater for all diets, cultures and religions.

A healthy snack

Please send in a healthy snack such as fruit, to be eaten at morning break (no nuts).

Children should also have a refillable water bottle.

'Extended Day' facility

Early Club begins at 7.30am and is available for children from Kindergarten through to Prep VI. Later in the day, Prep children who are not collected by 3.45pm are taken to Wraparound Club in the Prep Library where they are looked after by trained staff until 6pm.

For your convenience, you can take advantage of our 'Extended Day' facility without prior notice. No advance booking is required.

There is a small additional charge for these facilities. Please see our 'Extended Day' leaflet for further details.

Homework

Homework is a very important aspect of the pupils' development. Each pupil has a homework diary in which the work for the evening is written. Parents, or other adults, are requested to sign the entry to confirm that the work has been satisfactorily completed. Messages can also be sent home and to school via the homework diary.

Homework is set to cement an effective partnership between school and parents in pursuing the aims of Bridgewater School. It is designed to reinforce skills and understanding, particularly in literacy and numeracy. Homework also encourages pupils to develop the confidence and self-discipline needed to study independently.

Online learning games have significantly benefitted our homework provision. The Times Tables Rockstars, Reading Eggs and Typing Club enable our pupils to develop their skills in a competitive yet friendly environment, giving their teacher useful assessment information. This homework is supplemented by more traditional activities such as maths and reading.

Essential Information – School Uniform

The school dress code

A full uniform list is included within the Prep Parent Handbook and is also available from the school office.

Here are some important points in brief:



- Children wear their PE kit on timetabled PE days (please see class timetables)
- Girls should wear regulation pinafores. Summer dresses are compulsory for all girls after the Easter holiday
- White ankle or long socks with summer dresses and grey or black opaque tights or long socks with winter uniform
- Shoes should be a black, full shoe with adequate foot support. In summer, sandals must have closed toes and heels. Boots of any kind are not permitted
- Top coats must be regulation and bought from the school outfitters
- No jewellery may be worn. Girls with pierced ears may wear one stud in each ear – no hoops
- Long hair must be tied back with either navy or black hair bands
- Trainers are essential for playing outside
- All pupils must use the standard school bag. There are two styles: an Infant one for EYFS and a Junior one for Prep I to VI
- Pencil case containing basic stationery equipment
- Prep V invite pupils to use a quality fountain pen (Lame or Parker) when they are ready
- All uniform must be clearly labelled with your child's name.
